Grundy Library: Opening doors, inspiring minds, connecting community

80'S Escape Room Teens in grades 6-12 are invited to join us as we rock the 80's and try to escape the Library! Attendees are encouraged to dress up 1980's style, as we eat, enjoy some 1980's trivia, and eventually break into teams to escape the Library.

Adult Book Discussion (Drop-in) The book discussion club meets the last Wednesday of every month with the exception of December. A book pre-selected by club attendees is informally discussed. This month's selection is *Educated* by Tara Westover.

Celebrate Art! Exhibit Opening Reception (Drop-in) Join us for the **Celebrate Art!** Opening Reception on Thursday, March 7, 2019 from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm. See creative works by the Artists of Bristol on the Delaware and students from Bristol High School and Harry S. Truman High School. You'll have the opportunity to meet many of the artists and vote for your favorite art pieces. Light refreshments will be served. The exhibit continues through Saturday, March 30, 2019 during regular Library hours. The reception and exhibit are FREE events and no registration is required.

Cook the Book: International Foods *Cook the Book* is a book club for cooking enthusiasts of all ages. It meets four times per year plus a year-end Cookie swap. Register and select a recipe from one of three pre-selected cookbooks from the Grundy Collection. Registrant makes one recipe for the Saturday meeting, enough to share a taste with others; there is no need to double or triple a recipe. The library will provide plates, bowls, napkins, eating utensils, etc. *Please note that this program involves food and/or drinks prepared for and by the participants and, therefore, attendees choosing to partake of the food and/or drink available during the event do so at their own risk.

Code Club Session 1: Grades 2-4 Using Prenda software, attendees will learn how to code in Blockly, JavaScript, HTML/CSS and Python. They will learn how to build websites, video games, and apps. All participants will have access to the Prenda website for all of 2019. Students can bring a laptop or Chromebook, or register in the library to borrow a Grundy Library Chromebook. Session 1: January 21- May 28, Session 2: June 3- August 27, Session 3: September 3- December 17.

Cruise into Kindergarten (Drop-in) Ages 3-6 will enjoy stories, songs and rhymes along with fun activities, toys and crafts to introduce skills needed to succeed in kindergarten.

Family Fun Night (Drop-in) Families with children ages 2 and up are invited to join us for Color & Light STEM night this month.

Knitting & Crocheting (Drop-in) This is an informal gathering of knitting and crocheting enthusiasts of all skill levels. Free instruction is available. Drop-in and join the fun.

Let's Learn Ukulele for Teens and Tweens! Join us as we learn to play the ukulele! In this four week series of STEM based music lessons we will learn about chords, rhythm and the science of sound. We will also explore current music technologies. Bring your ukulele if you have one or borrow one of ours!

Makerspace Mondays Join us every 1st & 3rd Monday afternoon for a chance to learn something new. We will be learning about electricity, 3D printing, robots, coding, button-making, and more. This program is for youth in grades 5-12.

Movie Club (Drop-in) Movie Club is open to adult patrons 18+. Short discussion with members following movie showing. Refreshments will be served! Please feel free to bring your own comfy chair! This month's selection is *Chappaquiddick*, PG-13.

Nutrition Links Penn State Extension's Nutrition Links is a free program that offers educational classes to participants to develop the knowledge and skills necessary to achieve a healthful diet on a limited budget. Our goal is to help them use the resources available in the most healthful and economical ways possible. Who may attend this free workshop series? Parent or caregivers of a child 19 and under, adults, and older adults who qualify for: free or reduced school lunch; WIC; SNAP benefits, food pantry boxes/bags; and Pennsylvania Farmers Market vouchers. Participants receive a certificate of participation upon completion of the program (four classes).

Play Date at the Library (Drop-in) Stay and play after Tiny Tots Story Time or drop in to play with educational toys and make new friends! For children ages 1-5 with a parent or caregiver.

STEM Career Fair (Drop-in) Do you like helping others? Do you like solving interesting and challenging problems? Do you like working on practical problems that need creative solutions? Do you want to make a difference? If you answered "YES" to any of these questions a STEM Career may be for you! Join us after school to meet with local businesses and college/technical schools.

Teen Advisory Board (TAB) Join the Teen Advisory Board! Volunteers wanted in grades 6-12 to help with programming, book selection, and more. We meet on the second Thursday of the month, and yes there will be snacks. As a bonus it can be counted toward community service hours.

Tiny Tots Story Time (Drop-in) Share the joy of songs, rhymes and reading together. For children ages birth to 3 years with a parent or caregiver.

Walking Club You're invited to join us for the Grundy Walking Club in Bristol Borough. Enjoy the health benefits of walking and learn a little about the town's rich history as you cover a one-mile route within Bristol's Historic District.
