## Grundy Library: Opening doors, inspiring minds, connecting community

**227 days in Space: Astronaut Daniel Bursch's Journey** The Margaret R Grundy Memorial Library is pleased to announce that former NASA Astronaut Daniel W. Bursch will appear at the Bristol Riverside Theatre (120 Radcliffe Street) in support of the Library's *NASA @ My Library* initiative. In the event, Mr. Bursch will discuss his education, his career with the United States Navy, and how both served as a foundation for his journey to space. Due to limited seating at the theater, **tickets are required for this all-age, free event. **Book Discussion (Drop-in)** The book discussion club meets the last Wednesday of every month with the exception of December. A book pre-selected by club attendees is informally discussed. This month's selection is *The Immoralists* by Chloe Benjamin.

**Cook the Book** A book club for people to discuss and share their cooking adventures continues. This is a great opportunity for cooks of all ages, skill levels and interests to share their love of cooking as well as eating, while trying new recipes from the library's collection. To participate registrants must visit the library and choose a recipe from among the cookbooks selected for the discussion – **Vegetables and Fruits** Staff will photocopy your selected recipe, giving you a copy as a participant and keeping a copy on-hand to avoid duplication. Lastly, you make one recipe, no need to double it, and bring it to the first book club meeting at the library. While you sample and taste the various foods, we'll discuss all things pertinent to the recipe. The Library provides the plates, napkins & utensils. Discussion runs from 2:00pm-3:30pm.

**Game Night (Drop-in)** Join us for the monthly Drop-In Game Night. Assorted board games (for ages 3+) are supplied for this fun-filled family evening. Learn games you've never played before and revisit some favorites. This is a drop-in event; no registration is required. This month's featured game is *Robot Turtles*
